Dr. Johnny Tam's NeuroCARE Study

A digital health monitoring research Study looking for speech biomarkers in Parkinson's Disease.

The study takes about 30 - 40 mins.to complete and, as he describes in the presentation, involves reading aloud some text (that they provide) while they record the voice.
